

Dear AIR Awards Committee:

We are proud to nominate Dr. Victor (Vic) Borden for consideration for the Sidney Suslow Scholar Award for 2020. This prestigious award seeks nominees whose scholarly work has significantly advanced the field of institutional research; represents original, meritorious, and/or creative contributions or applications; and is recognized as being of high quality in its implications and applications for institutional research and related higher education policy and practice. Dr. Borden's sustained contributions through his leadership, original research and scholarly publications provide strong support for this nomination.

Dr. Borden is a longtime member of the Association for Institutional Research, and is currently a Professor of Higher Education in the Higher Education and Student Affairs program at Indiana University – Bloomington (IUB). In addition to this, Dr. Borden has worked in various capacities relating to institutional research at IUB, Indiana University – Purdue University at Indianapolis (IUPUI), George Mason University, and the University of Massachusetts.

During his career, Dr. Borden has made many important contributions to the field of institutional research through his scholarly work. As you will see from his CV, he has published more than fifty studies in edited books and monographs, along with a number of journal articles and other publications since his entry to the field of institutional research. Dr. Borden's scholarship has focused primarily on assessment and accountability in higher education, institutional research, and psychology and higher education. Dr. Borden's scholarship has been instrumental in shaping the way that institutional researchers look at assessment and accountability, and focuses on the application of theories and concepts to higher education issues. It is important to note that many of his publications have been in outlets that are central to the field of institutional research. He is the editor / co-editor of two volumes of New Directions for Institutional Research, and a contributor to many volumes and books pertaining to assessment in higher education. He is affectionately known as the "accountability czar" at Indiana University.

In addition, Dr. Borden has contributed to the field of institutional research in other ways related to his scholarship. He served as President of the Association for Institutional Research, and thus guided decision making for the Association's umbrella of publications. He is a member of the Consulting Editorial board for Research in Higher Education, and was named one of the five outstanding reviewers for the journal. Vic has been a regular presenter at the Association's annual Forum. He is the founder and faculty member of the AIR Information Technology Institute and a faculty member of the Enrollment Management Institute and the Statistics Institute. In addition to his AIR service, he is a regular presenter of research at IR-related meetings and conferences around the world.



Re: Nomination of Victor M. H. Borden

I have observed his career since Vic Borden and I joined the faculty and central administration of Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) in 1992 to form a new administrative division: Planning and Institutional Improvement, I as Vice Chancellor, and Vic as my Director of Information Management and Institutional Research (IMIR). In addition to his 110% job in IR, Vic first earned tenure, then the rank of full professor in a tough department-Psychology-in the Purdue School of Science at IUPUI. In 2005 Vic transferred from IUPUI to Indiana University Bloomington (IUB) to become AVP for Planning and IR, and in 2010 he moved his professorship to the Higher Education program in the IUB Department of Educational Leadership and Policy Studies. While Senior Advisor to a system-level VP at IU, beginning in 2010 Vic also served as Higher Education Program Chair and coordinated its Graduate Certificate in IR. In 2014, he added the title of Project Director for the nationally-recognized Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education to his already-full portfolio of administrative responsibilities.

Strong evidence of Vic Borden's qualifications for the **2020 Sidney Suslow Award** is presented in the following accomplishments: while employed full-time as an IR professional and high-level administrator and as a faculty member at IU for 27 years, he has also become widely recognized (e.g., with several best paper and best presentation awards as well as peer-reviewed publications) for significant scholarly work that has advanced IR theory and practice; has served as AIR President; and has received the 2011 AIR Outstanding Service Award.

At IUPUI Vic Borden created new reporting strategies for existing data on student enrollment and success and designed new surveys to gather additional information on student and alumni satisfaction with academic programs and student services. He presented these data in such convincing ways that soon faculty and administrators at all levels were listening. Based to a significant degree on the trustworthy evidence Vic was providing, IUPUI faculty began to make improvements designed to bolster student success that had not been considered previously. For instance, in the mid-1990s Vic's data helped convince faculty and administrators that University College should be established as an academic unit dedicated to giving first-year students the best possible preparation for their subsequent academic work. Those data later furnished the evidence that convinced several national organizations to recognize University College for its progress in producing positive student outcomes.

We instituted at IUPUI an institution-wide 10-year program of comprehensive peer review for academic departments, bringing in faculty from universities outside Indiana with expertise in each program area to read a self study, interview faculty and administrators, and produce a report summarizing current status and areas for improvement. Vic and his IMIR colleagues played key roles in helping faculty in each department assemble the data they needed to tell their departmental stories most effectively. All Vic's good work contributed significantly to the distinction accorded IUPUI in 1997 as one of six Best Practice Institutions selected in the international "Measuring Institutional Performance Outcomes" benchmarking study conducted by the American Productivity and Quality Center.

When in 1999 IUPUI received funding from the Pew Charitable Trusts to lead the Urban Universities Portfolio Project, Vic assumed the responsibility for developing the technical aspects of an electronic portfolio for a consortium of six universities. His effective work later made it possible for IUPUI to be the first university to submit entirely online its self-study for institutional reaccreditation by the North Central Association.

In addition to developing Diversity Indicators to gauge IUPUI's progress in achieving this important component of its campus mission, Vic Borden was called on to conduct the annual national study of degrees conferred to students of color for *Diverse Issues in Higher Education* and *Community College Weekly*. He performed these analyses for 25 years, from 1991 to 2016. Of course this visibility led to invitations for Vic to speak about increasing diversity in higher education on campuses and at meetings across the country.

Vic has advanced understanding of IR in so many ways: as a teacher and mentor for graduate students taking his courses, as dissertation chair, as a curriculum developer and coordinator of the IU Graduate Certificate in IR, as a developer and director of the AIR Technology Institute, and as a faculty member in over 60 additional AIR Institutes and other workshops and webinars. His scholarship has advanced theory and practice in the focus areas of higher education classification (and national ranking) systems, learning analytics, institutional eportfolios, dual credit, student success factors, faculty workload measures, and performance indicator systems.

Vic has served as a consultant to NCES, the Higher Learning Commission, IPEDS, and NSF. Now his scholarship and ability to advance the understanding of IR are being recognized internationally. He has a growing number of publications in international periodicals, some with co-authors from other countries. He has been a keynote speaker at several AIR affiliates: Southern Africa, Australasia, Middle Eastern/North African, UK, and Chinese. He has developed and delivered IR workshops in Australia, China, Malaysia, and South Africa. He is a regular presenter at the annual meetings of the European Association for Institutional Research, and has published chapters in EAIR-related publications.

As an appreciative recipient of the Suslow Award myself, I sincerely believe that Victor M. H. Borden has more than fulfilled the expectations associated with the award, namely, significant scholarly contributions to the field of IR and advancement of the quality of practice in the field. It is with great pleasure and admiration that I write this letter of support for Dr. Vic Borden to be the recipient of our Association's Sidney Suslow Scholar Award. I have known Vic for over 20 years and have had the privilege to collaborate directly with Vic in a number of IR projects and activities through INAIR and AIR, including as a member of the Board of Directors, a member of the AIR Institutes, and also on committees. There are few who can match Vic's sustained and significant contributions with the deepest commitment and dedication to the promotion of institutional research. His scholarly work, teaching, consultancies, and volunteer services can attest to his many contributions to our field. Therefore, I strongly recommend that Vic be given the Sidney Suslow Scholar Award because he is truly deserving this honor.

Nationally, Vic is well-known in our field and the broader higher education community through his research on the assessment of organizational performance within higher education institutions. In addition to his teaching and administrative duties at Indiana University and other professional engagements in the community, Vic is recognized for his leadership as the Project Director in leading the nationwide effort in updating and enhancing the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education for facilitating benchmarking studies and educational research. His research on education quality and accountability has made significant contributions to the field, and he is most sought after by both higher education associations and institutions to offer consultation on quality improvement and accreditation initiatives. Having been involved in quality and continuous improvement projects for our campus and beyond, I have found Vic's work insightful and particularly helpful in my own work.

Globally, Vic is also well-recognized and well-respected by members of the global higher education community serving as an invited advisory panelist, author, reviewer, and keynote speaker to advance understanding to the international audience on a variety of topics with respect to performance assessment and institutional research. Some of the countries that Vic has been invited to share his work include Australia, Austria, Canada, China, Hong Kong, Ireland, Netherlands, Poland, South Africa, Taiwan, UAE, and UK, etc. Most notably, Vic was chosen in 2010 by the U.S. State Department and the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board to receive a Fulbright Specialist Award for his recognized expertise in assessing organizational performance to provide assistance to the

University of KwaZulu-Natal in South Africa for enhancing institutional effectiveness and promoting student success.

As busy and occupied as he is with many responsibilities, Vic is also known for his passion for institutional research and his generosity in sharing his time and expertise with fellow researchers and his students--from examining potential implications of education policy changes, to formulating research plans for conducting statistical analysis with real-world constraints. Respecting his expertise, I have often approached Vic for his advice on research design and analysis and he never once turns down my requests for help. His enthusiasm to grow institutional research into the future cannot be understated, as seen by his active involvement in the education and training of future institutional researchers.

I must also mention that Vic is a multi-talented scholar, writer, teacher, musician, and artist. In addition to mentoring his students at Indiana University, delivering keynote addresses at conferences, and contributing articles for higher education journals, Vic also uses his sharp wit and sense of humor to lighten up learning and connect with his fellow institutional researchers through fun songs with his original lyrics on common challenges and familiar issues facing our profession. When I think of the songs he often sang with his fellow AIR Windbreakers, I can't help but wear a smile on my face for songs with titles like IR State of Mine, Computing with HLM, and SQL Agent Man.

Vic is most worthy of the Sidney Suslow Scholar Award because of his passion for IR and the many contributions through his scholarly work to our field. He deserves the recognition of our peers and the prestige of being a member of the select group of scholars who have previously received this award. Dear Committee Members:

This letter is in support of Dr. Victor Borden's nomination for the Sidney Suslow Award for Scholarship. I believe Vic's scholarship in the study of higher education and institutional research has been important and continuous over the past thirty-five years.

My colleagues, in their letters supporting Dr. Borden's nomination, outline and discuss his impressive publication record in peer reviewed journals as well as his sustained work in analyzing black student graduation rates and community college productivity. I too want to recognize these works as important contributions to our understanding of the workings and productivity of the Academy over the past 35 years. However, in this letter, I focus on another aspect of Dr. Borden's scholarship, that of instruction and mentorship.

As outlined in his Vita, Dr. Borden has worked his way through the faculty ranks, now holding the rank of Professor at IU-Bloomington. During his career, he taught undergraduate and graduate level courses, and sat on or chaired graduate committees. In addition, he has directed and taught in IU-Bloomington's Certificate Program in Institutional Research since 2012.

While teaching a number of undergraduate psychology courses early in his career, his primary instructional activities have been the mentoring of graduate students studying various aspects of higher education. He has served on or chaired 19 graduate committees, currently serving on six doctoral committees. Of these 25 committees, Vic has or is chairing 14. The purpose of a graduate program is to educate and train individuals to be professionals, academic or administrative, in higher education. A primary role of graduate committee members throughout the students' program is to mentor students into the roles they have chosen to pursue. Many of the research topics addressed by graduates of the program are related to the practice of institutional research and student affairs. As outlined in his Vita, during the past several years, Dr. Borden's mentoring role as a graduate committee chair has increased significantly.

A second scholarly activity of Dr. Borden has been his support and leadership in IU-Bloomington's Certificate in Institutional Research Program. This Program was originated through a four-year grant (\$195,000) from AIR in 2001. Vic was one of three IU faculty members who were awarded the grant. Between the years 2002 and 2008,

Dr. Borden taught 30 sections of a one credit hour module, interacting with some 148 students. Since 2011, each year he has taught two courses in the Program, Foundations of Institutional Research (the introductory course) and Capstone in Institutional Research (the final capstone course for the Program). In these courses he has interacted with over 120 post master's students. Arguably, these two courses set both the foundation for expectations of the students, and define the quality of the Program's output. I would suggest this is and has been an important form of mentoring institutional research professionals.

Finally, I would like to recognize an outcome of Dr. Borden's scholarship. Vic's selection to teach workshops and seminars nationally and internationally, as well as invited presentations, have been based, at least in part, on his substantive publication record reflecting original research. This form of recognition reinforces the value placed on his research by editorial review boards of the many journals in which he has published.

Dear Committee Members:

I am delighted to add my comments and strong enthusiasm for Dr. Victor Borden's nomination of AIR's 2020 Sidney Suslow Scholar Award. I have had the pleasure of knowing Vic as a professional colleague for nearly three decades. In many ways, he conveys scholarly qualities and professional character that affirm his qualification for this award.

I first met Vic through AIR professional activities including Forum presentations, serving on AIR committees, and through our mutual participation as faculty members in the AIR summer institutes that were held in the 1990s and early 2000s. I marvel at Vic's broad knowledge of institutional research, strategic planning, and education generally. His knowledge of higher education institutions is deep and broad, and his base of experiences, both nationally and well as internationally provide him with a wide array of examples for how institutions implement institutional strategy. He has a strong grasp of the relevant higher education literature and uses it daily in his work as professor of higher education, as the project director for the Carnegie Classification system, and as senior advisor to the Executive VP for University Academic Affairs at IU (I've often wondered how he does it all and so well).

In recent years, I have relied on Vic as one of my 'go-to' colleagues when I have a question on institutional research, strategic planning, international higher education, or higher education research more broadly. I was honored that Vic served as the lead author in a book chapter with me in 2015 and as a solo author in another book chapter for me in 2018. Vic was recently nominated for Indiana University's W. George Pinnell Award for Outstanding Service (results not available at this time), another indication of his scholarly dedication to service. Furthermore, Vic's experiences internationally are also deep and detailed. His work with colleagues in Africa, the Middle East, Singapore, and beyond signal his leadership and knowledge of IR and higher education. He takes his knowledge of US higher education and situates it within the international context to offer comments and suggestions that are relevant for that particular audience. This is exactly what a good higher education scholar and expert should do.

While Vic can be serious and a thoughtful professional, he also has great wit and a marvelous sense of humor. I remember fondly his crafty humor, sometimes displayed in song or lyrics or both. At one of the AIR summer institutes, I remember fondly his wit with lyrics on IR as he played the guitar. I also remember his appearances (with other AIR colleagues) as the 'Vic and the Windbreakers' entertained AIR audiences on numerous occasions. He has a knack for being fun and serious at the same time.

I urge the committee to consider Dr. Victor Borden for the 2020 Sidney Suslow Award. You will not find a finer nominee. I'm honored to know Vic, and I hope he considers me half the scholar that I consider him. I'm sure you agree that Vic displays all the criteria for this award, hands down. Thank you.
